[Price (subject to change) is \$35.] This edition of the Bible has excellent introductions to each section of the Bible and to each of the books as well as many helpful and informative notes and maps.

The purpose of this course is to provide the student with a basic survey of the main content of the Bible together with a brief survey of its development in the form in which it exists today.

The assignments specified for each week are due the following class meeting. The *Workbook* pages are perforated and may be removed and submitted.

The *Bible Workbooks* were originally written with high school students in mind; however, as noted in the books' introductions, they have been successfully used in adult Bible studies and colleges. As you work through them, you will find that you are gaining or reinforcing a knowledge of the major characters and themes of the Bible, and afterward you will be well-prepared for the in-depth Bible studies you will be pursuing.

The *Workbooks* will occasionally instruct certain procedures such as memorizing verses, marking passages in your Bible, or doing projects for "presentation in class." While all of these will contribute to the value of your study, they are required for this course only if specifically mentioned by your instructor. If, however, the book calls for paragraphs to be written "on separate paper," they are to be written and submitted. Also, the maps included in the *Workbooks* are to be marked as specified and submitted. Be sure to **read and study** all material such as outlines found in the Workbooks.

There are no written assignments for *The Bible Book by Book*: rather, you are to study the appropriate

sections in conjunction with your work in the *Workbooks*. Similarly, there are no written assignments for the booklet *How to Study the Bible*. As you complete the reading of these booklets, sign and hand in the confirmation sheets located at the end of the syllabus.
