The Ancient World and Survey of Hebrew History S02#1

A study of nations that surrounded the Mediterranean. Findings of archaeologists in Babylonia, Assyria, Persia, Egypt, and Israel. The development of the Christian Church; the rise and fall of empires; Greece and Rome. (Formerly Hist 105)

Additionally: A study of the Hebrew patriarchs and early founders of the nation; the Hebrew monarchy, the exile, the restoration, and the Hebrew prophets. The purpose of the course is to obtain a clear and systematic understanding of the origins and the vital teachings of Judaism and Christianity. (Formerly Rel 42)
