### From the Field—India excerpt from A Profile on Foreign Missions by Rev. B. Dawson

#### The Republic of India

Geography: *India* has an area of 3,166,000 sq.km. The capital of India is New Delhi. This vast country is located in South Asia bordering Pakistan, China, Nepal and Bangladesh. It also has extended coastal areas along the Indian Ocean.\*

**Population:** The population of *India* is estimated to be just over 1,000,000,000.\*

**Peoples:** *India*'s racial diversity is extremely complex. The two major ethnic groups are: The Indo-Aryan, which represents about 73% of the population. And the Dravidian, which represents about 25% of the population.\*

**Religion:** *India*'s constitution grants full religious freedom to all religions. In practice, however, Christians have often been the subjects of persecution. It is estimated that about 80% of the population are Hindu. Around 12% are Muslim, 3% are Christian and 2% are Sikh.\*

# The History of the Pillar of Fire Church in India:

The history of the Pillar of Fire Church in India dates back to 1985. In that year Joseph Raju became acquainted with the Pillar of Fire Church and desired to establish its work in India. After contacting Bishop W. Konkel, Joseph Raju and his father, John, were given permission to establish the Pillar of Fire Church near Vijayawada, southeast India. After establishing a congregation in Vijayawada, the Rajus began evangelizing the surrounding area with the gospel and this led to the

planting of several Pillar of Fire congregations.

In the course of years, Reverend Azariah Korabandi became attached to the Pillar of Fire work in India and was appointed overseer of the Pillar of Fire Church in that great country. Under his leadership our work in India has experienced much growth, and today the Pillar of Fire Church has a number of ministries in India involving thousands of people.

#### The Pillar of Fire Ministry in India:

The Pillar of Fire presently has 43 congregations firmly established in India. These congregations have church buildings and a permanent team of Christian workers. There are other, smaller, satellite congregations, which meet in the various homes of our workers and members. The Pillar of Fire Church also has one Bible College and three schools, where many children have been able to undertake academic training. We presently

employ 86 pastors and evangelists, who are ministering in 258 villages throughout the states of Andhra Pradesh, and Tamil Nadu in southeast India. The present membership of the Pillar of Fire Church in India is 8,200 people.

Besides our regular work of pastoring and evangelism, we are engaged in a wide humanitarian work in association with other Christian groups, reaching thousands throughout India. This includes building and maintaining: schools, orphanages, homes for widows, centers for leprosy victims, centers for mentally handicapped children, hospitals, and clinics.

#### **Areas of Need:**

The work of the Pillar of Fire Church in India has experienced considerable growth in the last few years. We have been able to plant new congregations and send evangelists to areas yet unreached with the gospel. India, however, is a vast country and heavily populated. Our ministry there is producing great results but it has the potential for much more growth and development.

The organization and leadership structure of the Pillar of Fire Church in India is well established and this makes our future missionary efforts in that country much more promising. There are many areas of need in India and the people are open to the gospel. Unfortunately, the economy of India is weak and millions of people live in extreme poverty. This means that many people in India are unable to sustain their churches and support evangelistic outreach. Within this area our greatest challenge lies. If

we desire to see India reached with the gospel, we will have to faithfully provide financial assistance in order to maintain and develop our ministry there.

#### **Update From Rev. Joseph Raju:**

Taken from a recent letter from Rev. Raju. "Six pastors working with me [around] my place. Every month first week I visit them and give holy communion. Recently I have given baptism to some Hindu converts. Bishop Wilbur Konkel Memorial Orphan Children's Home runs very fine. Twenty-five children getting food in the hostel morning and evening. They are all going to school. They are learning Bible in the Sunday School. This hostel officially opened by Rev. Bernard Dawson and Bro. Azariah. Pray for my ministry."

### Message from the Director Rev. Bernard Dawson

Report on trip to Lagos, Nigeria

Our Lagos congregation needs a place of worship apart from the seminary chapel where we are temporarily gathering. Our Field Director located a vacant lot in Lagos about a 10-minute walk from the seminary. He negotiated with the landlord, who assured us he was the landowner. After some investigation and negotiation the price was paid for a four-year lease.

We bought timber, metal roofing, concrete, etc. and began construction. The roof and walls were in place. We were in the process of mixing and pouring the concrete floor. It was taking shape nicely until the true owner discovered a building on his lot.

He engaged a band of 'thugs' (which is the Nigerian way) and ordered them to take the church to the ground. Under cover of darkness, this group of men armed with rifles, axes, saws and mauls began their nefarious assignment. They ripped doors from hinges, windows from their frames, and cut wooden 4x4's in two hoping to bring the 'evil house of God' to the ground. They did a major job of shambling the building but the four steel corner posts held the roof high and mighty. The building would not collapse.

Sensing they had kept the spirit of the law, and had rendered the building unusable, they shook hands all round, congratulating themselves on a job well done and drove off into the darkness. Nigerian justice had been exacted!

After a period of grieving we began searching for the truth. It's a long story but the owner was the older half-brother of the caretaker who leased the property to us. He had been ordered by his big brother to keep watch of this choice property. Apparently the temptation to greed proved irresistible and he caved when our representatives naïvely came to him.

We have released into thieving hands our

money and now only God knows if we'll get cash, tenancy or nothing back. There is so much corruption in Nigeria that it's hard to tell the truth from a lie.

One blessing in the midst of this is that an

officer of the seminary is also a pastor of the church where the right-hand-man of the property owner is a deacon. He has agreed to work with us as an intermediary and see if order can be brought out of this chaos.

Regrettably, we have experienced what is a common Nigerian problem. There are some wonderful Christians in that fair land but there are also some skilled, crafty, and unconscionable opportunists. We just

happened to find the latter.

Now we must

rebuild.


To the commendation of our growing congregation, they had been rushing to get the chapel completed so we could have the ordination of Luther Tarpeh in our official

### Trip to Moscow, Russia by Dr. Robert Dallenbach

For a number of years the Pillar of Fire has had a role in assisting at the Moscow Evangelical Christian Seminary. Our primary contact was a young man, Nikolai Kurnikov.

Dr. Harold Burgess, on staff at Asbury Theological Seminary, was teaching there from time to time, and invited Rev. Rob Cruver, President of our Somerset Christian College, to travel with him to participate in the Seminary. At that time, Rob became acquainted with Nikolai, who needed support in order to continue his studies at Moscow Evangelical Christian Seminary.

Since that time, we have provided for his needs in connection with the Seminary. He is an excellent translator and student. He is on staff at the Seminary. While I was there he traveled with me all the time, serving not only as guide and historian, but also as translator.

The mission of Moscow Evangelical Christian Seminary is to train evangelists, pastors, preachers, and Christian workers for evangelical churches and ministries in Russia and other countries. They have for a verse of inspiration, Philippians 3:8, "Everything else is worthless when compared with the priceless gain of knowing Christ Jesus."

The Seminary was founded by OMNS International, Inc. and the Korean Evangelical Holiness Church, in 1993. The Korean contingency developed a

separate program which began in the fall of 1995.

Since its inception, the Seminary has provided some 48 graduates. Nineteen are in full-time ministry and 24 are in part-time ministry.

I traveled to Russia with Dr. Harold Burgess. It was very helpful to have the opportunity to visit with him and gain from his experience in working in international settings for the advancement of the Kingdom.

I was asked to lecture at the Seminary in the following areas:

Spiritual Formation, Parish Ministry, Christian Dogmatics, and Preaching. In addition, there were formal times for interaction with the student body.

We were graciously received by the personnel at the Seminary. Dr. Bill Vermillion has been teaching there, although he does not speak Russian. Others on staff, of course, do. They have able translators that stand along with us when we have the teaching sessions. The President of Moscow Evangelical Christian Seminary is Alexei Dychkov.

The Seminary has the following offerings: Bachelor of Christian Ministry, Bachelor of Theology, Masters of Christian Ministry, Masters of Theology.

It was a challenging experience for me to

teach in a setting such as I described, in that we had students just beginning and those at the Masters level. Students come from a cross section of backgrounds, from a land that has recently had the door opened to evangelical efforts.

Russia is a developing nation in the lower half of the world's economies. It has a vast expanse of land that has not yet been fully utilized, primarily because of severe oppression since 1917. We can thank the Lord that through the enlightened leadership of President Ronald Reagan, a change occurred in the government of the USSR.

We now have the privilege to freely share the Gospel in Russia.

Part of the experience that I enjoyed was to learn something of the country's history, the severe tests that the land has sustained over the years

because of oppressive governments that have been in place.

It was a joy and a privilege for me to be able to share with them from my experience things that I hold as high priorities for Christian living and evangelism. It is a very challenging experience for this Seminary to reach out with an effort to bring evangelization to so vast a country, but God is helping them and one-by-one the task is underway.
